

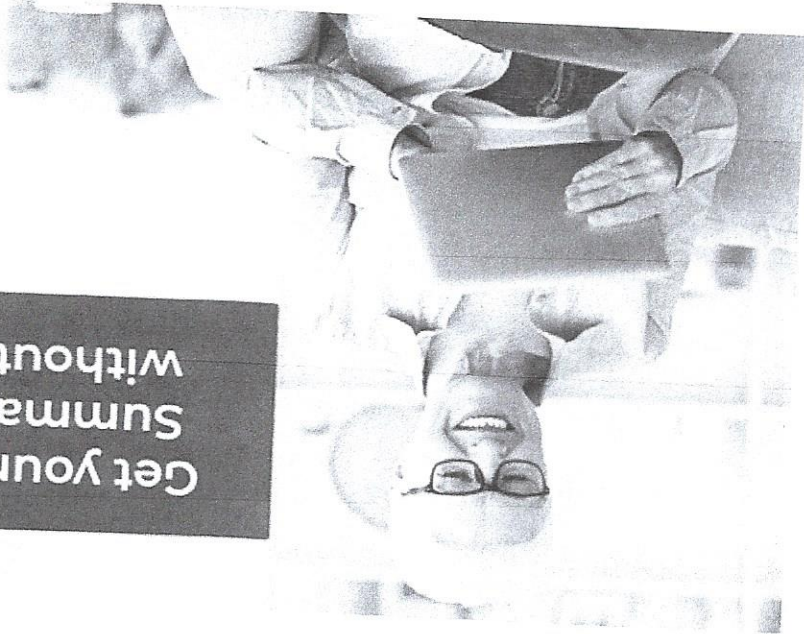

- Log into (or create) your secure Medicare account at [Medicare.gov/account](https://www.Medicare.gov/account) and select "Edit my account settings."
- Under the "Document settings" section at the top of your account settings, select "Edit" next to Medicare Summary Notices (MSNs).
- Under "Medicare Summary Notices (MSNs)," select "Electronically" then "Save Changes."
